Our Rehabilitation Support Workers (RSWs) work under the guidance of regulated health professionals as well as our regional care Coordinator. These are the front line workers who assist the client in achieving specific goals and objectives. They provide client-centred service in areas such as emotional support, cognitive and functional programming.

Our pediatric Rehabilitation Support Workers give families peace of mind. We are specifically educated and trained in child development, ABI and spinal cord injury. Our ability to engage clients throughout their childhood ensures that suitable care is provided at each developmental stage.

Wright Rehab provides Personal Support Workers (PSWs) to help with ensuring client safety, emotional support and encouragement. Our Personal Support Workers are skilled in personal care and sensitive to client needs. Many clients require help with day to day tasks while living independently. PSWs have a Diploma or Certificate in Personal Support Work and specialized training. They assist with bathing, grooming, feeding, dressing, as well as personal care, homemaking and meal preparation.

Our Respite Care Associates (RCAs) allow caregivers to take time for themselves. As RCAs we all have multi-year experience in the social services field as well as a postsecondary education. RCAs offer caregiver support and relief, client engagement and varied levels of support from basic supervision to assistance with complex medical/emotional needs.

Our Behaviour Therapists (BTs) provide assessment, programming, and treatment to clients who, due to their brain injury, require more specific interventions. This type of programming helps to extinguish, modify, or improve behaviours that may be problematic or impede client progress.
